Fare well to Mrs. Kavita Gupta

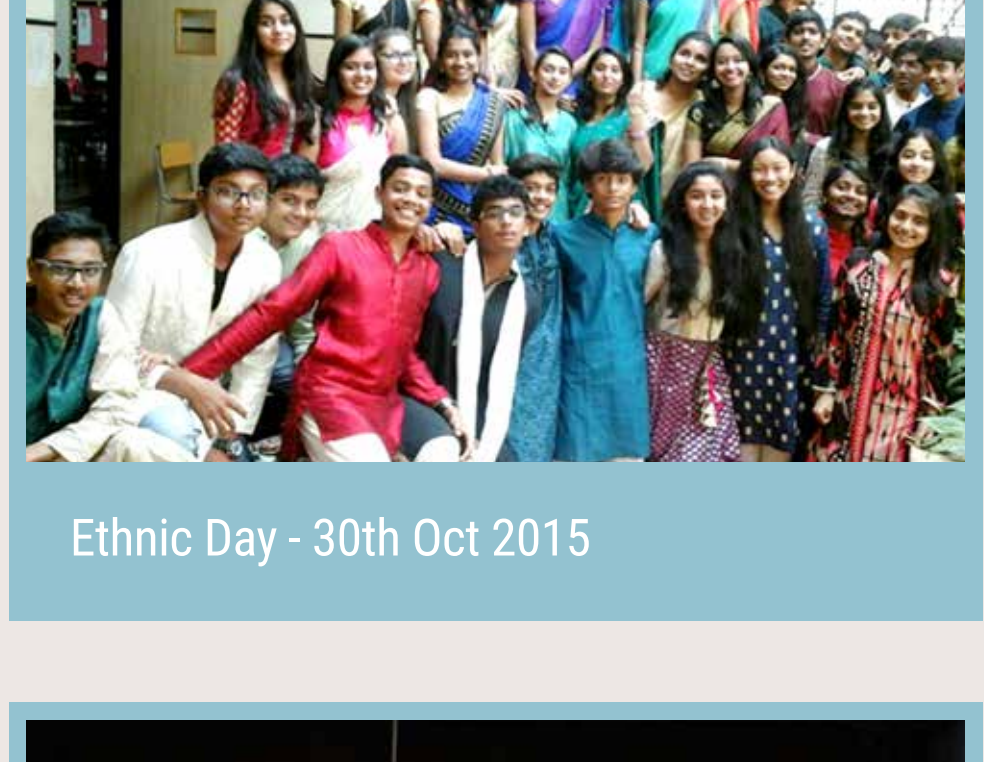

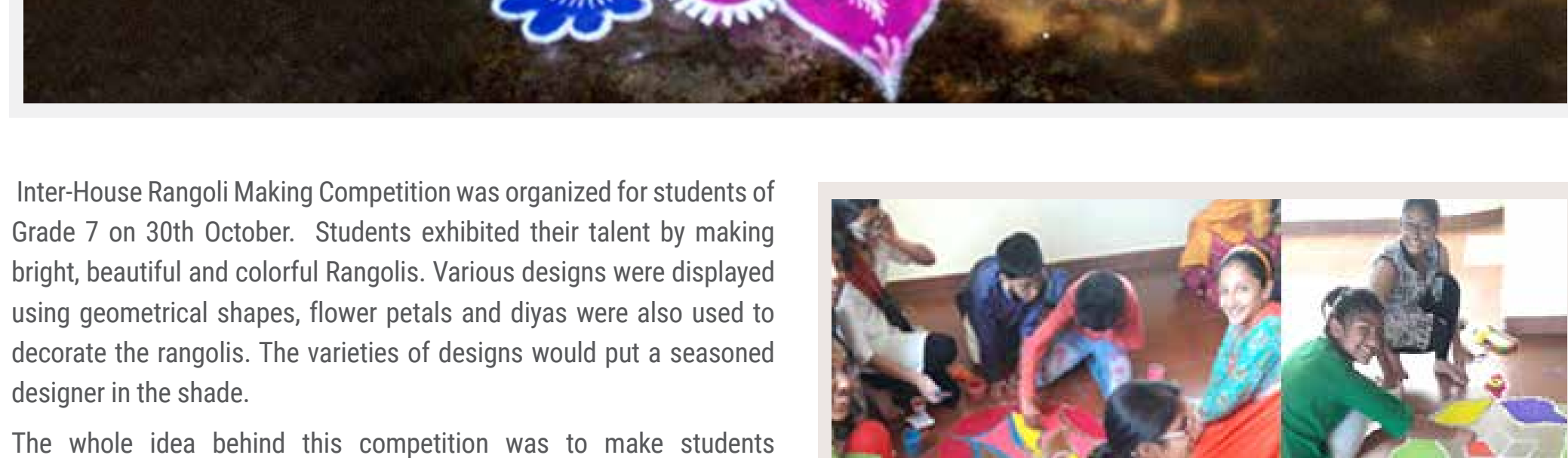
They also explained the speciality of their salad and the importance of including salad in a regular diet for maintaining good health and keeping diseases away.

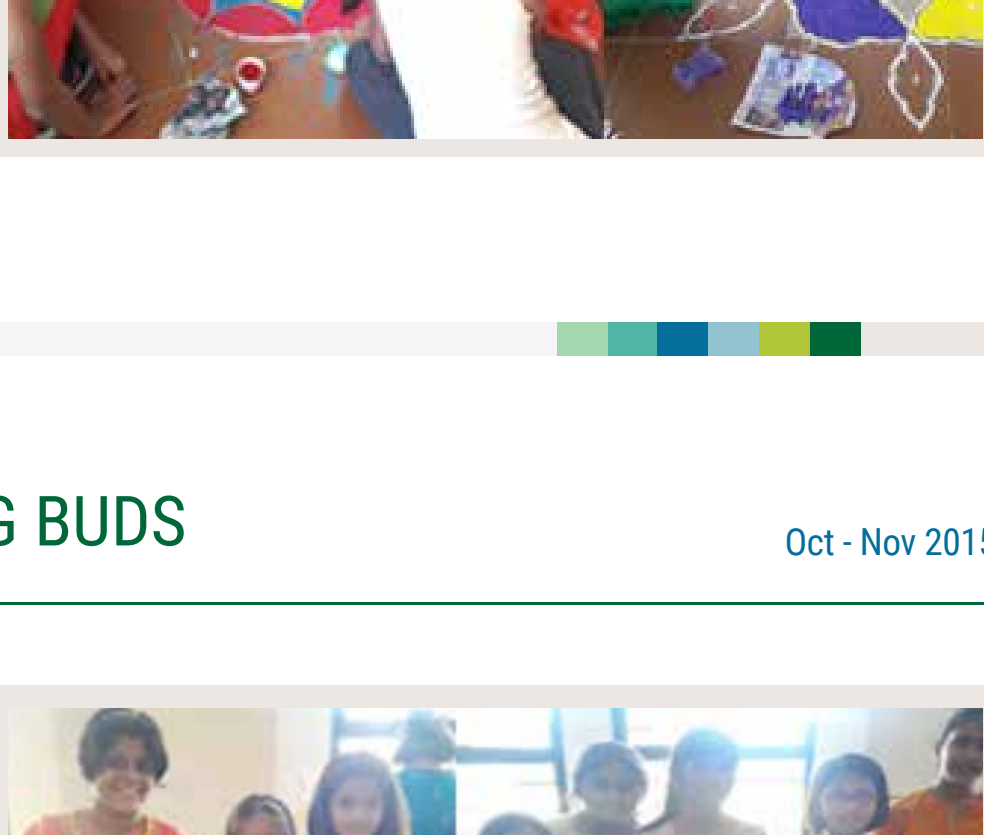

The competition was judged with the clarity of idea, space utilization, designing and overall neat presentation

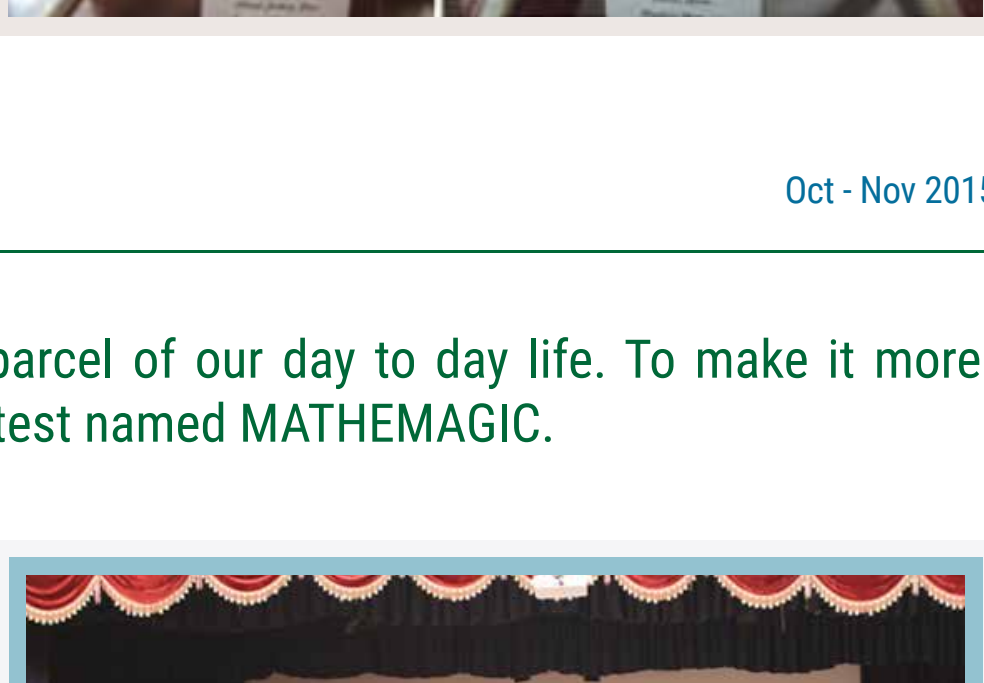


BLOOMING KIDS ARRANGED BLOOMING BUDS

MATHEMAGIC QUIZ

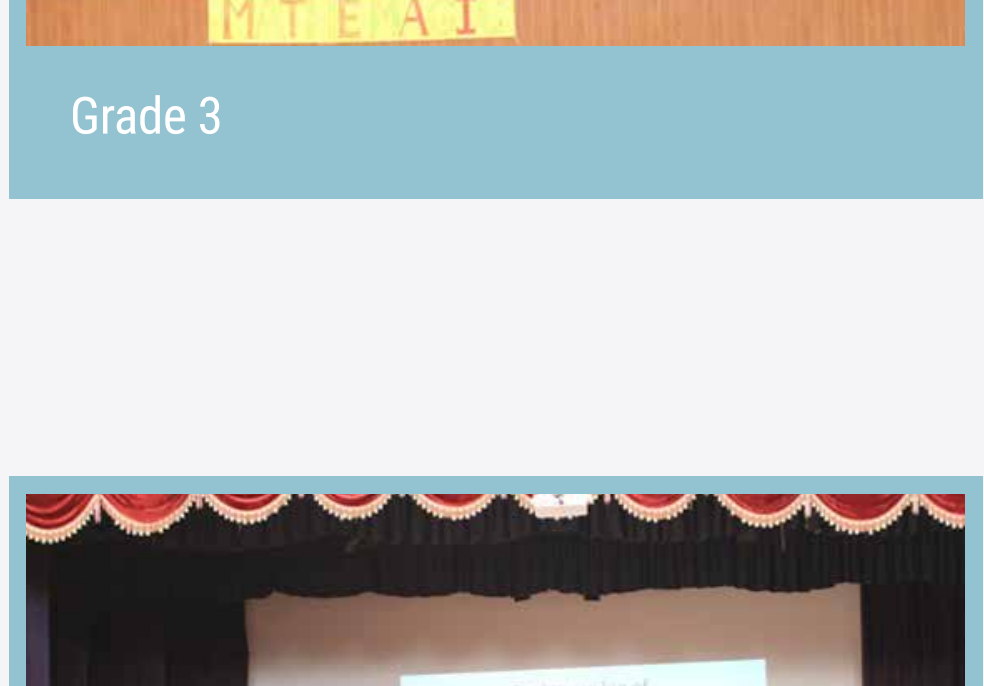
Oct - Nov 2015

Round 5 - Rapid fire round

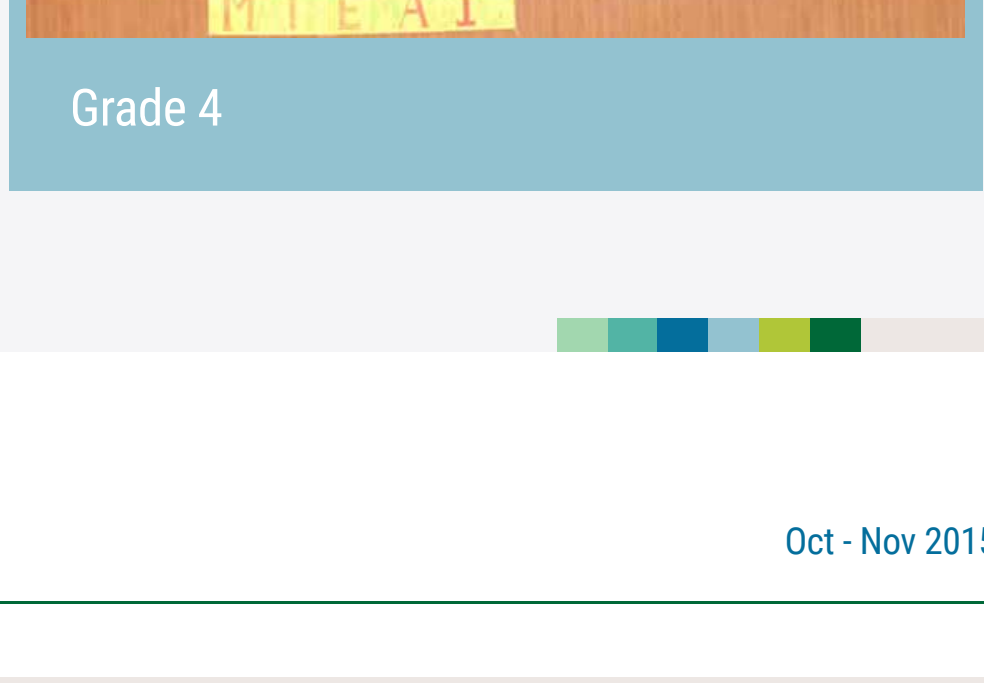
Children took part in the competition enthusiastically. Competition spirit among them was overwhelming.

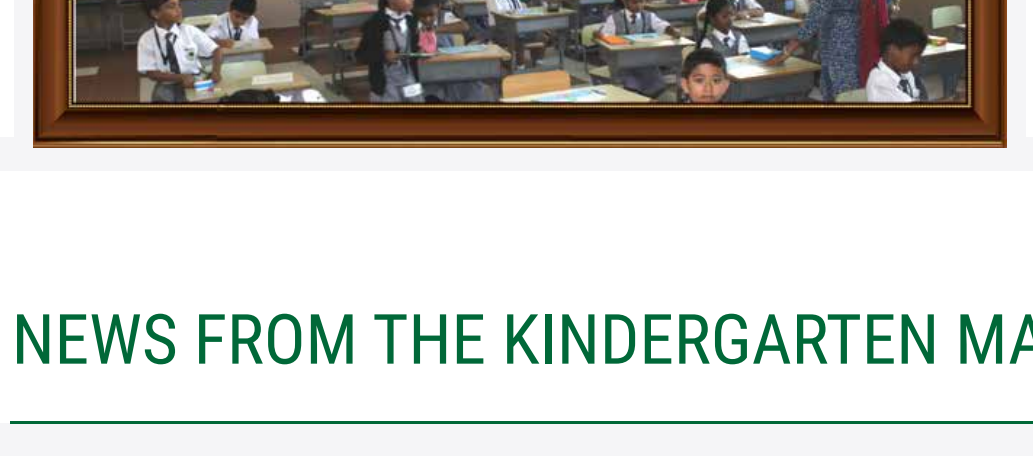
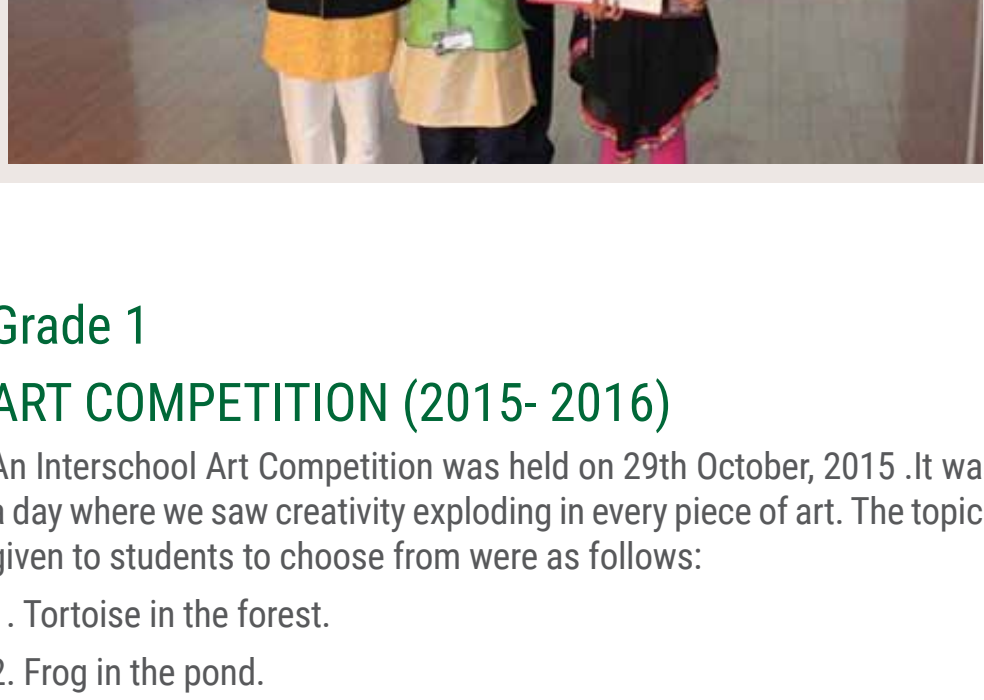
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SPELL BEE CHAMPIONSHIP.
